

How to Enroll in ASEP

The program limits its class size to 16 students. The first applicants to meet the enrollment requirements will be accepted.

- Apply and be accepted to the College of Southern Idaho
- Secure a GM dealership worksite—a worksite can be located anywhere in the U.S. We are available to help you in locating a dealer.
- Take COMPASS exam—your scores determine your current academic level.
- Meet with ASEP Counselor Karyl Myers to discuss your COMPASS scores. It may be necessary to take some preparatory classes before entering the program.
- Return the GM/ASEP application to Karyl Myers with a dealer signature.

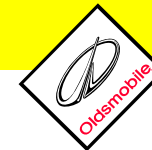

GM ASEP is...

A TWO-YEAR AUTOMOTIVE SERVICE DEGREE PROGRAM designed to provide the technical and professional competence required of entry-level GM dealership technicians. The program is fully certified by the National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF), and all students are required to pass an Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) test before graduation.

What Will You Learn?

The curriculum is designed by GM and CSI. Instruction takes place at the dealership and in the classroom and lab. Students rotate from work to school four times during the two-year program, spending two to three months at a time at the dealership.

GM ASEP Requirements

- Participants must be employed by a participating GM dealership prior to acceptance into the program and for the duration of the program
- Participants are responsible for the cost of all tuition, books, and related material as well as the required tools. (Tuition costs may be offset through various forms of financial aid and some of the leading tool companies offer substantial discounts).
