Cabinetmaking/Woodworking construction is *real, hands-on, learn-by-doing* instruction. You will be introduced to a variety of skills, techniques, and methods in cabinetmaking, furniture construction, and woodworking.



Approximately 90% of students graduating from this program are employed in the cabinetmaking industry.

We also enroll students in our woodworking club and Skills USA VICA (Vocational Industrial Clubs of America). This club provides students opportunities to go to state and national leadership conferences, and state and national skill competitions. The club offers learning opportunities through fundraising projects for the benefit of the members. These funds are used to send the students to seminars, competitions, tours, and to finance projects.
